It was determined that there needs to be some clarification of school participation in STAR Events. All Pennsylvania STAR Events (except PA specific events) follow rules and guidelines in the National FCCLA STAR Events Manual.

Statements referring to “state” participation in an event/category in the national manual would translate to “chapter” participation on the state level.

Examples:

“entries per state” translates to “entries per chapter”

“states may submit one entry in each category of this event” translates to “chapters may submit one entry in each category of this event”

When determining participation in STAR Events at the PA State Leadership Conference only **one entry per chapter per event category** will be accepted.
